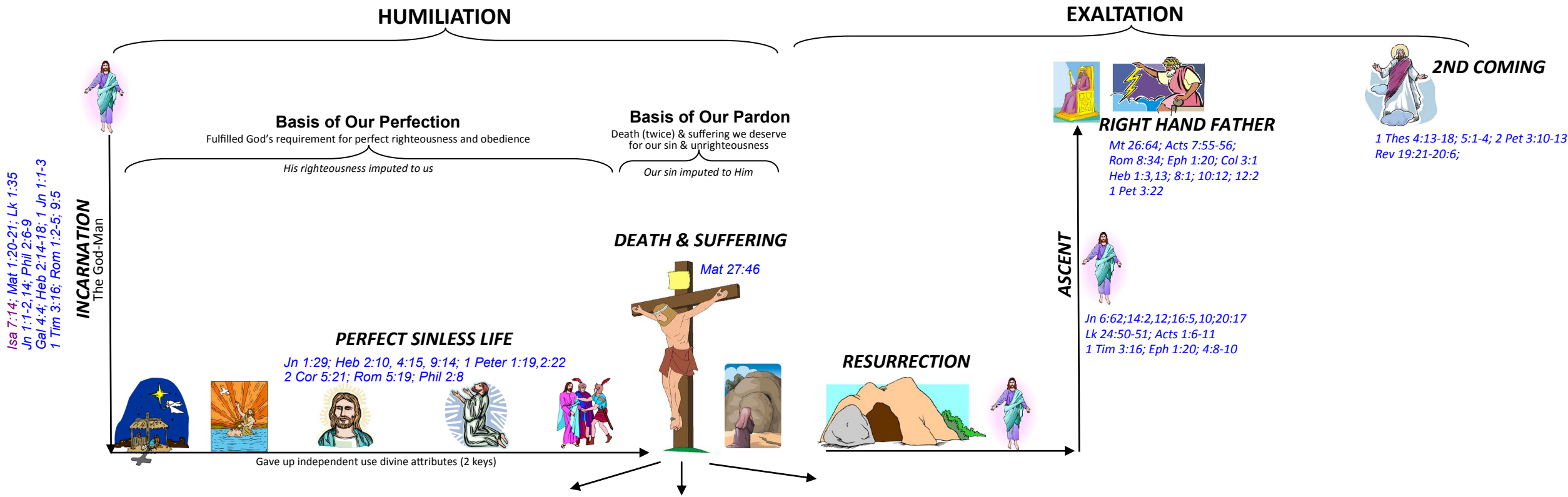

The Atonement

"Redemption Penal Substitution"

Substitutionary Atonement:	Propitiation (in relation to God)	Redemption (in relation to sin)	Reconciliation (in relation to man)
Grace Provided by offended party. Take the place of another. Instead of/In place of. NOT "on behalf of". Justice & love Completed sacrifice	Grace Turning away of Gods wrath by acceptable sacrifice of atonement He absorbed wrath of God. Righteous requirement satisfied Wrath unleashed not withdrawn JC = the propitiation & Mercy seat: <u>place</u> where blood for sin was deposited	Grace JC <u>paid price</u> by <u>His blood (death)</u> to <u>set you free</u> from bondage sin He became sin sacrifice and died Prisoner to free <u>From</u> slavery sin <u>by</u> Blood JC <u>to</u> Freedom & <u>to</u> Serve the Lord	Grace Restoration of relationship between God-man from hostility to one of peace. World now saveable 1. God to man: wrath to mercy/grace 2. Man to God: defiance to faith Enemy to friend, son, ambassador **Need to receive #2**
